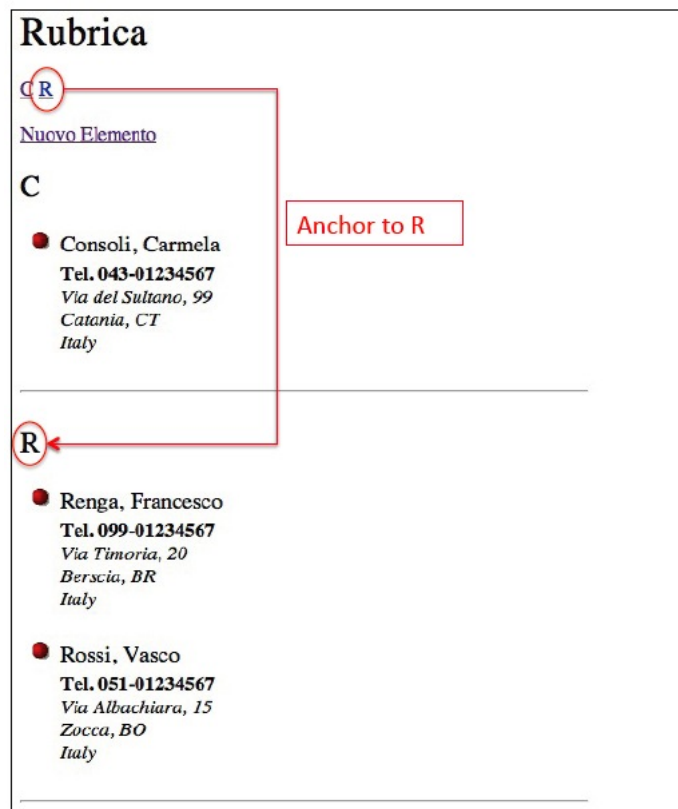


Exercise 1A
